

If you have a concern with how you have been treated and believe your fair housing rights have been violated, there is a local process for reporting your complaint.

Fair Housing - It's Your Right!

If you do not feel comfortable contacting the local office, both the Texas **Workforce Commission** Civil Rights Division (TWCCRD) and the United States Department of **Housing and Urban** Development (HUD) are available to help address problems regarding housing discrimination.

Complaints should be addressed to: the County Judge, whom has been designated to coordinate Section 504 compliance efforts. A complaint should be filed in writing or verbally, contain the name and address of the person filing it, and briefly describe the alleged violation of the regulations. A complaint should be filed within ten (10) working days after the complainant becomes aware of the allegation.

We Do Business in Accordance With the Federal Fair Housing Law

(The Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988)

It is illegal to Discriminate Against Any Person Because of Race, Color, Religion, Sex, Handicap, Familial Status, or National Origin

- In the sale or rental of housing or residential lots
- In advertising the sale or rental of housing
- In the financing of housing

- In the provision of real estate brokerage services
- In the appraisal of housing
- Blockbusting is also illegal
