Motion was made by Commissioner Wellman to allow Commissioner Precinct #4 to purchase the 2014 Extension Office Pickup from the General Fund for \$5,000.00. Second by Commissioner Wood and passed with a 5-0 vote, it is so ordered.

Extension Agent, Mason Carter is to start shopping for a 4 door 4X4 ½ ton gasoline pickup.

Motion was made by Commissioner Wood to allow Bena Hester, County Clerk/Elections Administrator to purchase 5 Electronic Poll Pads from Hart Intercivic at a cost of \$6,025.00. Second by Commissioner Francis. Voting For: Commissioners Wood, Francis and Wellman and Judge Nance. Voting Against: Commissioner Burson. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Commissioner Francis to allow Sheriff Davis to purchase a 2020 Chevy Silverado 1500 Crew Cab 4X4 pickup from James Wood Autopark for \$37,975.00. Second by Commissioner Wellman. Voting for: Commissioners Francis, and Wellman and Judge Nance. Voting Against: Commissioners Wood and Burson. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Commissioner Wood to adjourn. Second by Commissioner Burson and passed with a 5-0 vote, it is so ordered.
