Meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M. by Judge Rank Cogdell.

Motion was made by Commissioner Francis to approve the minutes from the November 13th, 2023 regular meeting and the November 13th special meeting for Canvass of the November 7, 2023 Election, as presented. Seconded by Commissioner Wood, passed with a 5-0 vote, it is so ordered.

Public Hearing: Stetson Renewables Holdings Reinvestment Zone: No One present

Commissioner Burson moved that the county approve and adopt the resolution, as presented, designating the Stetson Renewables Holdings Reinvestment zone, establishing the boundaries thereof and providing for an effective date. Seconded by Commissioner Wellman, passed with a 5-0 vote, it is so ordered.
