At a regular meeting of the Briscoe County Commissioners Court held at the Briscoe County Courthouse in Silverton, Texas, at which a quorum was present, the following order was adopted:

WHEREAS: Texas Election Code Title 6, Chapter 61, Section Subchapter A, is titled General Provisions; and

WHEREAS: Section 61.003 of the Texas Election Code is titled Electioneering and Loitering Near Polling Place; and

WHEREAS: Section 61.003 (a-1) allows an entity that owns or controls a public building to enact reasonable regulations concerning the time, place, and manner of electioneering; and

WHEREAS: Section 61,003 (b) (1) states "Electioneering" includes the posting, use, or distribution of political signs or literature;

THEREFORE, LET IT BE ORDERED that the Commissioners Court of Briscoe County. Texas, enacts the following reasonable regulations, that will remain in effect until repealed, concerning the place and manner of electioneering:

No political signs may be posted, displayed or placed on any property that is owned or controlled by Briscoe County, Texas, at any time, except in the following circumstance:

If there is a polling place located in a building owned or operated by Briscoe County, then persons may engage in electioneering during the hours those polls are open as long as the electioneering takes place more than 100 feet from an outside door through which a voter may enter the building, in accordance with section 61,003 (a) of the Texas Election Code.
